3. The luncheons were catered by the hotels where they were held. No tenders were sought; locations were selected on the basis of available facilities. The Per Jacobsson reception was catered by the University of Toronto where the lecture was held. The reception following the Canadian gala was catered by Winston's which submitted the lowest bid among several offered through the Thomson Hall administration.
