the development and distribution of communication materials such as pamphlets, brochures and visions.

The campaign has included the Prime Minister, several cabinet ministers, members of Parliament, provincial MLAs, the private sector, union and academic spokespersons and a broad effort to generate European media attention. The public information initiative targets European Community and member state decision-makers, industry leaders, European environmental and scientific groups and the media, particularly in Spain and Portugal.

Some specific examples have been parliamentary missions, including many of our colleagues from this House. In October of 1990, the Canadian Chamber of Commerce led a community development mission to Spain and Portugal comprised of key representatives of the Atlantic Canada fishery community. Also in 1990, a delegation from the Newfoundland-Labrador Federation of Co-operatives attended an international co-operative alliance meeting in Spain. A specially prepared brochure entitled The Fragile Fishery, which documents the foreign overfishing issue, has been widely disseminated in Europe and in all fisheries countries around the world.

In the spring of 1991, industry and union representatives accompanied the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans to Portugal, where he made a major public speech and held meetings with his counterparts.

The campaign remains a vital component of the government's efforts, and for 1992 a number of activities and new initiatives are already under way. Our mission to the European Community and our embassies in European Community member states and in NAFO member countries have been provided a detailed communications package in which to develop and present this very important and tragic story.

The campaign is being broadened to support more fully our legal initiative, particularly with respect to the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development to be held in Brazil later this summer.

During March we have invited foreign journalists from Europe and NAFO countries to visit Newfoundland. This will provide an opportunity for them to gain first hand the knowledge of the impacts of foreign overfish-

All of these efforts continue and none of them are particularly radical perhaps, but together they bring into focus this tremendously urgent and rapidly developing environmental disaster. In all things environmental, in the whole world of sustainable development, nothing starts without a sense of vision. We have to start again as a country and as a world with respect to our fishery on the Grand Banks to determine what is achievable, what can be done and then commit ourselves to those measures to accomplish those goals.
