April 16—Mr. *MacFarlane*—Whether is the intention of the Government to introduce during the present Session, (and if so, when,) any Bill for the regulation of traffic on Railways, and limiting the conditions of indorsements now placed upon Railway traffic receipts?

“ 24 Mr. *Keeler*—Whether the Government, having decided upon placing in the Estimates a sum of money for the Harbors of the Dominion, intend any portion of that sum for the Harbor of Pres-qu'Isle, on Lake Ontario.

“ 18 Mr. *Masson*, (Soulanges)—Whether the Canal constructed in 1832 at Coteau du Lac, in the Electoral District of Soulanges, on the properties of *Joachim Watier*, Esquire, and which was continued in 1841, from the said properties of the said *Watier*, along the bank of the St. Lawrence, in front of the properties as far as that belonging to *William French*, Esq, as described in the Report of the Department of Public Works, page 567, is in reality the property of the Dominion; and whether it is the intention of the Government to reclaim its right to the said Canal constructed out of the funds of the former Province of Canada, in view of the fact that certain proprietors of property in front of which the said Canal was constructed have declared themselves to be the proprietors thereof, and claim the sole enjoyment thereof, against all justice and equity, to the great detriment of their neighbors.
