

dollars annual value, as may be required for the use of the Guild or for the purpose of procuring revenue, and the same to sell, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate or alienate in any manner whatever ;

(c) to borrow money ;

(d) to exhibit goods wherever desirable, to hold exhibitions and to open depots, stores and shops.

(e) to appoint agents and instructors and to open schools and classes anywhere, for instruction in and concerning the objects aforesaid.

CORPORATORS.

4. The corporators shall be composed of the persons mentioned in Section I of this Act and of the life members qualified as provided by this Act and of the patrons, life governors and members qualified as provided by the Constitution and By-laws of the Guild.

GENERAL COMMITTEE.

5. The affairs of the Guild shall be managed by a general committee, which shall be elected annually by the corporators at the annual general meeting, in such manner and with such power as may be decided from time to time by the Constitution and By-laws of the Guild.
