JAMAICA DISPLAY WILL BE LAVISH

Finest Exhibit Ever Seen in Canada Will Be Shown at Canadian National Exhibition.

E. J. Wortley of the Jamaica Department of Agriculture, who has been sent by the Jamaica Government as representative at the Canadian National Exhibition, has arrived in Toronto. It is understood that he brings with him the finest exhibit ever sent from that country to this. Of the tropical countries and islands represented, none will afford the thousands of visitors from all parts of Canada and the United States so much instructive interest as will this beautiful British Island.

The court, which has been reserved for Jamaica and the other British West Indies, is the foremost court of the new government building, situated on the grand entrance plaza, near the new Lord Dufferin Memorial Gates. Jamaica is to have more space than all the other islands combined and will be first on entering the pillared doorway.

The exhibits will include all the important products of the island, from Panama and Jippi jappa hats to good old Jamaica rum.

The tourist interests will have a special stand within the court, and will be in charge of Mr. Lewis W. Clements, president of the Canadian Travel Club, whom Mr. Wortley has selected as being most familiar with the tourist world, from both the northern and southern standpoints. Mr. Clements has spent much time in Jamaica and has for some years been a very enthusiastic worker in the interests of the island. It was through his energy that many Canadians visited Jamaica last year.

There will be tables at which will be served, free of charge, the highest grade coffee in the world. The whole exhibit will undoubtedly be the finest tropical display ever brought to Toronto. The object being to show Canada that Jamaica is after Canadian trade and tourists in real earnest.

OPPOSED TO SUNDAY SHOOTING.

LONDON, Aug. 16.—(C. A. P.)—The army authorities are receiving protests against the Sunday rifle practice by territorials. The protests are chiefly from dissenting bodies. The official reply is that the territorials are obliged to go to distant ranges and as there is no time in winter for working-men to make such journeys, except on Sunday, the army council feel it cannot but approve of the action of any man willing to sacrifice his time in traveling to the range on Sunday.

The council, however, has issued orders discouraging any Sunday shooting, except when forming a part of compulsory training and is necessary for efficiency.

CAPT. LORD IN OWN DEFENCE

No Responsible Officer on Californian Aware of Serious Calamity, He Declares.

LIVERPOOL, Aug. 16.—(Can. Press.)—W. Stanley Lord, who was captain of the Leyland Line steamer Californian at the time of the disaster to the Titanic by which 1517 lives were lost, issued a statement to-day defending his conduct. He declared that if the Californian had been the steamer sighted from the Titanic, she would also have been sighted from the Cunard liner Carpathia.

Captain Lord states that the stigma cast upon his character and seaman-ship is undeserved and unjust. The evidence he says, is conclusive that none of the responsible officers of the Californian were aware that there had been a serious calamity. The second officer was the only one who saw signals, so Captain Lord argues that he was justified in relying on that officer's judgment, that the vessel sighted steamed eight miles between 1 and 2 o'clock on the morning in question, whereas the Titanic did not move after midnight.
