

**KILLED BY STRUT LOAFERS -
ITALIAN FIRES INTO CROWD**

Washington, Pa., Feb. 24.—Roland McLeod, a young man of this city, was shot and instantly killed to-night by Santo Paurore, an Italian, who narrowly escaped being lynched by an enraged crowd. The killing resulted from alleged insulting remarks, which a crowd of young men are said to have addressed to the Italian, who was escorting his two sisters.

The Italian turned and fired five shots.
