THE EXPORT DUTY ON LOGS Sir Mackenzie Bowell Wanted to Know Whether the Dominion is With Ontario.

HON. DAVID MILLS KNEW NOTHING, Except What He Saw in the Newspapers, and Said It Was a Provincial Fight.

Ottawa, June 23.—(Special.)—In the Senate this afternoon Sir Mackenzie Bowell, on the orders of the day, called the attention of the Minister of Justice to newspaper reports that the Attorney-General of Ontario had granted a full American exemption from holding timber limits in Ontario, with a view of testing the constitutionality of the law imposing an export duty on logs cut on those limits. Of course, as the Dominion Government had allowed the law, he concluded that it was not to be tornly disposed towards it. He wanted to know if the Dominion was a party to the suit.
