The Filipinos ill-treat and ill-feed them, refusing to surrender them, as well as the other Spanish prisoners, in the hope of compelling Spain to recognize the independence of the islands.

There are 14 American prisoners, they say, at Tarlac, all of whom are well treated. Lieut. J. C. Gilmore of the United States gunboat Yorktown, who fell into the hands of the insurgents at Baier, on the east coast of Luzon, last April, where the Yorktown had gone on a special mission to relieve the Spanish garrison, is at Bingat.

Canada Cycle Stock.

The World yesterday interviewed Mr. J. W. Flavelle, president of the National Trust Company, as to the cause for the heaviness in the preferred stock of the Canada Cycle and Motor Company.

Mr. Flavelle stated that there was no change in the position of the company as compared with the time when the prospectus was issued by the National Trust Company. Prior to that time, the value of the security, which was the outcome of the amalgamation of the various bicycle companies, was carefully weighed by the executive officers of the Trust Company before they consented to introduce the shares to the public. Four weeks ago, when the stock was listed on the Stock Exchange, the market was suffering from tight money conditions and the apprehension arising out of the indefinite position of Transvaal matters. As a result of this some subscribers, who, probably, subscribed speculatively and who found difficulty in making payment for their shares, disposed of their holdings at par and a little over. "The amount thus offered proved to be more than the usual buying orders would look after, and some shareholders, who had apparently been expecting the stock to go up rapidly as soon as listed, became disturbed, and were, I think, unwise enough to take a loss. 
