OTTAWA, March 24 .- (Special) .- For the encouragement of physical and military training in the public schools of Canada, Lord Strathcona has made the generous donation of \$250,000, a sum which will yield \$10,000 a year for the patriotic purpose designated by Canada's high commissioner in Lon-


