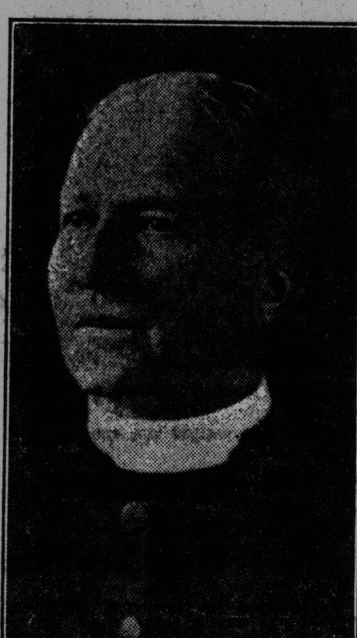
## REV. R. P. MCKIM BECOMES CANON

### Bishop Makes Announcement—Business of Synod Committee Meetings.

Rev. Robert Phillip McKim, rector of St. Luke's church, has been appointed canon of Christ Church Cathedral, Fredericton, succeeding Rev. Canon R. A. Armstrong, who has removed from the diocese. The appointment was announced last night by His Lordship Bishop Richardson. Clergy and laity alike throughout the diocese will extend congratulations to Canon McKim on receiving this special honor which he has well merited.

Canon McKim became rector of St. Luke's church, St. John, in May, 1895, and during the 29 years in which he has shepherded his flock in St. Luke's, his ministry has been specially blessed and he himself has found a place of very warm regard in the hearts of his people. In the city and throughout the diocese, Canon McKim is held in highest esteem and his ability as a Bible teacher is of wide renown. He was born in Toronto and is a graduate of Wycliffe College. charge was as rector of St. John's church in West Toronto and from that congregation he came as rector to St. Luke's church. He has a brother,

Canon C. W. McKim, missionary canon in Saskatchewan. His son, Rev. R. Taylor McKim, rector of St. Mary's church, was ordained priest in May, 1915.

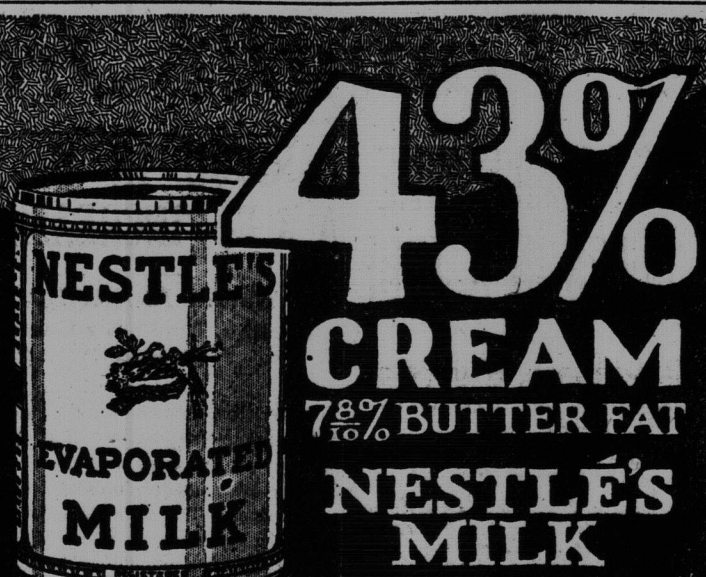
### Committee Meetings.

In the morning the Board of Church Literature met with Rev. W. H. Sampson presiding. Rowland Frith, treasurer, reported the finances of the book room of the Church of England Institute were keeping up well. Bishop Richardson presided at the meeting of the standing committee, of which Rev. Canon A. W. Smithers was re-elected secretary, and at the board of finance, at both of which routine matters were dealt with.

At the meeting of the Social Service Council Rev. J. V. Young presided and amongst those present were Bishop Richardson, Rev. H. T. Buckland, of Springfield; Rev. A. F. Bate, of Fredericton; Rev. C. S. Gray, of Oromocto; H. A. Porter, W. S. Fisher, W. E. Anderson, H. Usher Miller, Mrs. Beard, Miss Alice Walker, Miss Grace Robertson and many of the local clergy men.

The council strongly advocated the appointment of two or more women on the board of the Municipal Home by resolution requested the New Brunswick Social Service Council to endeavor to prevent lotteries and games of chance at all exhibitions and fairs in the province, and appointed a committee to look into conditions in all jails and prisons in the province with a view to ascertaining what improvements could be put in force and to see whether the prisoners were given work to do.

## DE VALERA OFFERS TO HELP ULSTER

Says North of Ireland is Justified in Its Stand.

Dublin, Oct. 16.—Eamon De Valera, in course of a speech here tonight, said the Republicans were going north to contest the elections there as the only party in Ireland standing for the unity and sovereignty of the nation. There could be no peace, prosperity or stability in either part of the country while it was divided.

The Republican leader declared that he admired the way the northern people had defied English coercion. If tomorrow there was an Irish call to resist any attempt at British coercion of any section of the people, north or south, there would be any number of volunteers in the ranks. While the Republicans denied the right of any part of Ireland to secede, they would help their countrymen anywhere to resist British coercion, and if Sir James Craig, the Ulster Premier, wanted volunteers to resist British interference, he invited him to come south for them.

C. G. Lawrence from Hampton; and Rev. C. R. Canham from Queensbury. Rev. Craig Nichols from St. John's.

Appointments announced were Rev. Mr. Gray to Stanley and Rev. Mr. Lawrence to Trinity church, St. John. A committee was appointed to prepare the budget apportionment for 1925 and a committee consisting of Rev. R. Taylor McKim, Rev. W. P. Dunham, Ven. Archbishop A. H. Crowfoot, Rev. A. L. Fleming, Charles Coster, J. H. A. L. Fairweather and Rowland Frith was appointed to consider the matter of organizing a diocesan missionary campaign.

The standing committee meetings conclude this morning.
