PROMINENT BAPTISTS (Maritime Baptist).

Among other bequests in the will of Dr. J. F. Tufts was a legacy of \$10,000 for the Maritime Baptist Church at St. John, N. B. for many years a faithful and valued member of the Wolfeville church.

Rev. J. H. Rushbrooke, of London, expects to visit the United States and Canada in the near future. He was appointed some months ago in behalf of the Baptist World Alliance as a Commissioner for Europe.

Rev. C. Orrington Howlett has been called to the pastorate of the Andover church, Perth field and expects to take up his work there about the first of May. For four years he has given faithful and efficient service to the church on the Bath field.

Since early in the Rev. J. B. Hogan has been serving in connection with the Military W. M. C. A. For more than a year he has been attached to the military Sanatorium at Kentville. His term of service there will soon end and he is anxious to return to the regular pastoral service.

A copy of the catalogue of the Newton Theological Institution has recently come to hand. In the list of graduates who are candidates this year for the degree of master of theology there are twenty-one names, and six of these are maritime men and graduates or former students of Acadia—Clarence Frank Bleakney, Bridgewater, Mass.; Guy Garfield Bleakney, Braintree, Mass.; Herbert John Blosse, River Herbert, N. S.; Leonard Harris Crandall, Chipman, N. B.; Ross Chipman Eaton, Malapan, Mass.; and Thomas Serrard Roy, London, Ont.

Toronto Baptists have lost one of their outstanding laymen by the death of William Davis, founder of the William Davis Co., pork packers. He was in his ninetieth year. One of his recent benefactions was the gift to the Master of Wallingford Hall as a residence for the women students of the University. His subscription to the Forward Movement was \$20,000.

Rev. F. C. Burnett has accepted a call to the Pleasantville-Daystar field. When he broke out he was one of the first to respond to his country's call, serving as stretcher bearer in many hot engagements. Finally he suffered from shell shock and returned home with serious nervous trouble.

Rev. A. T. Dykeman has tendered his resignation as pastor of Zion church, Yarmouth. We are sorry to learn that this action was taken on the advice of his physician. Pastor Dykeman grew old so slowly that one is apt to forget that already he has rendered over forty years of pastoral service.
