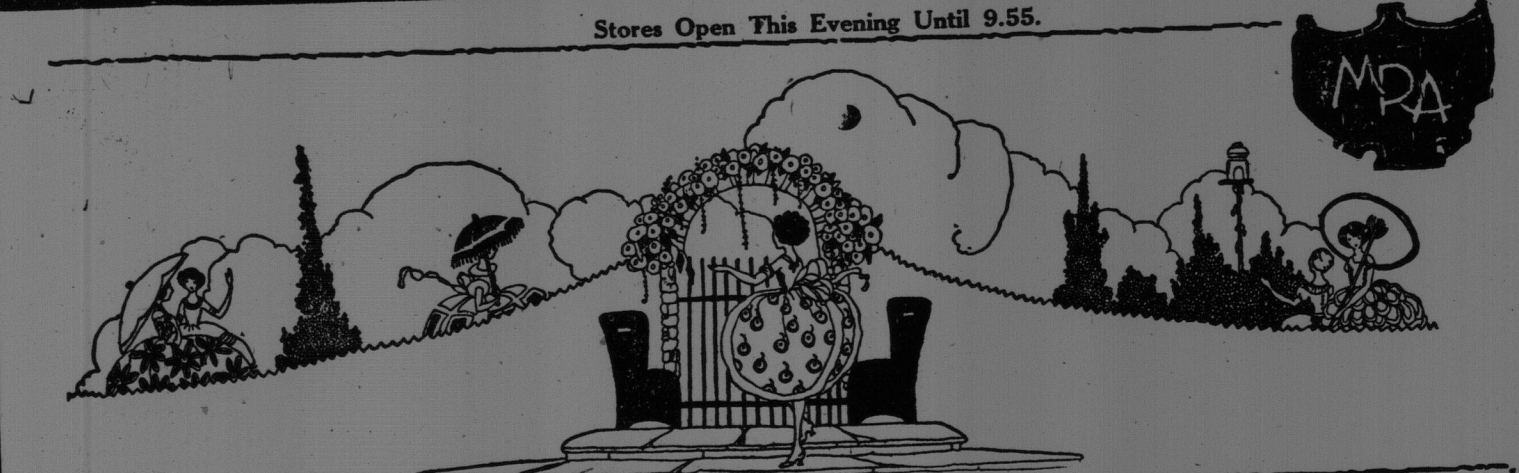

# HON. CHARLES J. BONAPARTE DEAD

Baltimore, June 29.—Hon. Charles J. Bonaparte, of Baltimore, died at Belle Vista, his country home, near here, last night. He was attorney-general of the United States in the Roosevelt cabinet and was a noted public speaker and a leading layman of the Roman Catholic church.

He was a descendant of the Corsican family of Napoleon Bonaparte, whom he resembled in facial features. Death was caused by heart and kidney trouble. He was 70 years of age.

**DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH**  
**AMENDMENT TO**  
**FOOD REGULATIONS.**

No meat, breadstuffs, cake, pastry, fruit, fish, candy, confectionery or other article whatsoever, whether solid or liquid, intended as food for man, shall be kept, sold, or offered for sale either without or within any store, shop, warehouse or other building, or in any street or public place, or on any ship, unless such article of food shall be kept properly covered, so that it shall be protected from dust, dirt, and flies or other harmful contamination; and all vehicles used for the delivery or conveyance of any article intended as food for man shall be kept clean, and all such food so conveyed shall be covered as to be protected from detriment, so far as may be, by the weather or other atmospheric influence, and from contamination by flies, dirt, dust or other detrimental matter.

**GUARDSMEN BOMBARDED**  
**BOOZE-FILLED WOODS**
