Since then steady progress has been made with the plans, and it is understood that hey are now ready to be submitted to he directors of the company. It is said that the engineers will present Iternative plans for bringing the water ower to the turbines, which will convert into electricity. One plan calls for the coavation of a tunnel through the solid ock twenty-five feet in diameter and near-1,000 yards in length. The other plan for a canal of almost equal length.
