

While the Committee offer their grateful acknowledgements to all the Members, for their zealous regard to the objects of the Society, they have only to add their respectful recommendation for continued perseverance, in their good endeavours. An ample supply of very interesting books, is now within their reach, for the best Religious and Moral Instruction of their children, their servants, and their poorer neighbours—They will readily consider it a duty to avail themselves of such important advantages, by providing for the instruction of their own families, and of all within their influence; and will assist the effect of such instruction, by personal superintendence and direction. The sphere of their useful exertions, may thus be gradually but powerfully extended, and numbers may be added to the Society, by their recommendation, by the influence of their example, and by the valuable effect of their attention and labor.

The Committee feel that their thanks are especially due, for the exertions in behalf of the Society, which have been made by a very large proportion of the Clergy in the Diocese; and confidently hope for a continuance of these valuable exertions, as they look for success, only, through the Blessing of Divine Providence, upon the permanent and untired continuance of the zeal and attention of the Members. The Committee respectfully recommend that an union with the Society should be made *Parochial*, whenever it may be possible; for experience has shewn that the objects of the Society are most successfully advanced, and always form a very happy bond of Parochial usefulness, union, and affection, whenever they are promoted by the general co-operation of the Rector, Church Wardens, Vestry, and
