

MINUTES
OF THE
FIFTY-FOURTH ANNIVERSARY
OF THE
Nova-Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society,
HELD IN TEMPERANCE HALL,

ON MONDAY, 18TH NOVEMBER, 1867.

The Chair was taken by REV. R. F. UNIACKE, President, at half-past Seven o'clock.

The Chairman called upon the REV. MR. LOGAN to give out a hymn and engage in prayer.

The PRESIDENT addressed the meeting.

The SECRETARY read the Thirty-ninth Report of the Committee.

It was, on motion of the REV. E. M. SAUNDERS, seconded by the REV. A. W. TURNER—

RESOLVED,—That the Report, an abstract of which has just been read, be received and adopted as the Thirty-ninth Report of the Nova Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society, and that the same be printed, with the usual appendages for circulation, under direction of the Committee.

It was moved by the REV. F. ALMON, seconded by the REV. J. FORREST—

That this meeting would contemplate with thankfulness, the great work which God has accomplished by means of the British and Foreign Bible Society, during the past sixty years, and resolve in the exercise of faith, prayer, and legitimate effort, to seek the full accomplishment of the work of the Society,—that every child of the fallen family of Adam may be able to read in his own tongue, the wonderful works of God.
