Meeting of Grand Lodge of Maritime Provinces. KENTVILLE, N. S., Aug. 9.—The forty-fourth annual session of the Grand Lodge of Oddfellows of the Maritime Provinces has opened here.

Grand Master McDonald in his address reported the order in a healthy and prosperous condition, new lodges being organized and the membership increased.

Grand Secretary Frazer's report showed that 334 members were initiated and joined by card during the year, while 35 were removed from roll by death, cards, etc.

The morning session was taken up with the reception of reports, etc. No session was held at New Brunswick.

The Grand Encampment finished its work Monday night. This branch also made an increase of 40 members.
