KINNEL PARK COURT MARTIAL

CASES ARE COMPLETED

There Have Been Twenty-six Acquittals on the Charge of Mutiny and Twenty-three Convictions—Nineteen Acquitted on All Charges and Seven Were Acquitted of Mutiny Who Were Convicted on Less Serious Charges.

London, Wednesday, June 11, C. A. P. delayed.—The general court martial in connection with the Kinmel Park disturbances has now heard its last case, which was the fifteenth on trial.

Appeals have been lodged against some other convictions. The Canadian Associated Press is informed that after half of the cases were tried objection was taken to the court trying any further cases on the ground that the court had been subject to a strenuous task in listening to the same charges against 500 men, and to hearing the same witnesses repeatedly.

It was argued, the Canadian Associated Press understands, that no jury would be allowed to sit for such a period without fresh panels being called. The court overruled this objection. It is understood that the matter is under consideration for the autumn further at Ottawa.
