minion Board of the Retail Merch-ants' Association of Canada, called for the special purpose of discussing the operations of the Board of Com-merce and held at the Chateau Laur-ier, closed this evening after a short but eventful seesion. Tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock a delegation representative of the Do-minion Board and the Ottawa and Eastern Ontario District will wait up-on a committee of the Federal Cabinet to present a series of resolutions em-bodying grievance against the Board of Commerce, and other matters of vital interest to Canadian merchants. This committee was representative of every province of the Dominion, dele-gates being present from Vancouver and Halifax. It was presided over the Dominion President. The chief item of business which took up the major portion of the ses-sion was a discussion of the opera-tions of the Board of Commerce. The merchants comprising the trades effected by the rulings of the Board of Commerce were critical in their explanations, and their views have been drafted into resolutions which will be submitted to the gov-arment tomorrow. 
