IRISH LAND BILL
Provides for Acquiring 80,000 Acres Compulsorily
Chief Secretary Makes Impassioned Plea "To Bind Up Well-nigh Broken Hearts and Stanch Bleeding Wounds" of Inhabitants.

London, June 28.—Mr. Birrell, chief secretary for Ireland, drew a gloomy picture of the want of Ireland in introducing the evicted tenants' bill in the house of commons yesterday. He said: "Rain is falling pitilessly, the turf is rotting and the seaweed used as manure is as wet as when taken from the sea. Such a measure as this will be taken by that population as a token of good feeling. It will do much to bind up many a well-nigh broken heart, which has just been issued. There are two thousand tenants to be reinstated," said the secretary, "and the government wants to make a clean job of it, and must acquire land compulsorily."

MILKMEN WANT
GOVERNMENT TO
APPOINT INSPECTORS
Decide to Place Matter Before Health Board, and if That Fails, Petition Government; Meanwhile License Time Expires.

At a meeting of milk dealers of the city held Friday, the matter of inspection of dairies was taken up and a resolution was passed recommending that government inspectors be appointed for different districts, and the present system abolished.

Several milkmen expressed themselves strongly as disapproving of the present system of inspection, and at the same time expressed their willingness to accept of government inspectors if appointed.

The resolution not only expressed approval of the scheme of appointing government inspectors under regular pay, but provided for the appointment of a committee to confer with the board of health, with a view of having the scheme of general inspection adopted.

The time for the milkmen to take out licenses with the board of health expired yesterday. The large majority of them have neglected to do so, and proceedings will be taken against them in the police court.
