Wall Street has resumed something like its normal appearance, and the excitement consequent on the panic is rapidly subsiding. The Stock Exchange being closed, a pretty active business, for cash, is being transacted on the street, and prices are advancing.

The first National Bank of Memphis has suspended; all its branches in Augusta, Ga.; and several business failures are reported in Richmond, Louisville and other places.

Foreign exchange has been fixed at 106 for 60 days bill, and 107 for sight, by leading bankers, but the actual business is at a lower rate.

A St. Louis dispatch says shipments of flour east have been virtually suspended by recent advance in railroad freight. The Board of Directors have petitioned railroad companies to restore the old rate during the present financial troubles.

NEW YORK, Sept. 25. THE PANIC—ENGLISH GOLD. There is no new feature in the financial crisis, and no new failures in this city are reported. The panic is rapidly extending in South Western cities. The leading cities of the West have so far escaped and adopted measures of safety as far as possible.

One hundred and eighty-four thousand pounds in bullion were shipped from Liverpool for New York yesterday, the City of Buenos Aires.

LONDON, Sept. 25. THE NORTH POLAR EXPLORATION. Captain Baddington and his companions of the Polar sailed for America Tuesday in the steamer Antwerp. Several steamers have offered them free passage.

GOLD FOR CANADA. The steamer Scandinavian today for Quebec took out \$500,000 in bullion.
