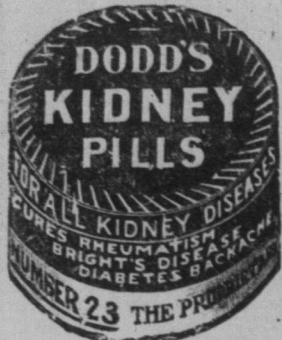

A PIONEER WEDDING.

First Knot Tied at Twin Lakes in the Grande Prairie.

First events in new localities are always of interest, and very often they are also significant. For instance, the first settling of the new western north of Canada means the making of good history, and as part of an important chapter in that history some place is due an event so socially unique as the first white wedding.

In a little log cabin at Twin Lakes was recently celebrated the first white wedding in the Grande Prairie district of the new western north. The example has been set, and more events of this kind may be looked for in due course. The north is getting more like other places. Bye-and-bye there will be wedding style and hymeneal pomp just like the rest of the world, but the first wedding is the one that marks real social history. The houses in Grande Prairie, which is a part of the famed Peace River country, are all log structures and built after the same general plan. The walls are caulked with plaster, the roof is of wood or sods, the doors are of the same material and the whole dwelling is one story in height. But a log house of this kind is warm if built well, and a reasonable amount of housekeeping skill will make it cozy. In the case of a log house at Twin Lakes there had been neighborhood parties and such like, but never before anything of the importance of the wedding.

The ceremony was brief. A northern homesteader will not tolerate too much formality, and the man who will now go down to history as the first white man to get a white wife in the Grande Prairie is a splendid fellow. The bride fixed up a little, as brides always do, but there were no fancy incidentals on either side. That the groom appreciated his good fortune is beyond doubt, for instead of answering "I will," he said "Sure," as I that is infinitely more expressive as well as more western. The "sky pilot" accepted it at par and secretly registered his approval of the innovation. And so the names of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Craiger are added to the list of immortals. In Grande Prairie they head the list. There were presents for the bride, and it is immensely popular, a wedding supper for all, and a honeymoon sleigh-ride in a big box-sled for the happy couple and some of the party. After all, weddings are much the same west or east, north or south.

The movement of people into the new north, bringing with it the whole round of social conventions and social relationships, is one of the most significant features of our expanding Canadian life. The wonder of it does not wear off—that away up there in the wilderness a settled and ordered society is forming, making the waste places into a land of homes and home delights. The tide of settlement is only just getting under way. In the Grande Prairie district, for instance, there is at present a total population of only 250 white people—including 113 bachelors and 41 women—but every week is making it larger. The trek is on and men and families are moving in from everywhere. Many, like the man who got married, are from across the border, and the influx of American settlers, most of them bringing cash and effects with them, will be more than usually large this year. The approved time of going into the country is in the last half of the winter, before the rivers and lakes break up, for the trail is then hard and smoother and easier to travel than in the summer. It is a picturesque procession that is kept moving along the trail all the way from Edmonton to the Peace River during this trekking season. It is made up of a long line of freight-sleds, propelled by stout horses or clumsy oxen and loaded with miniature department stores. Some of them are the supply teams, some of them the passenger coaches, the latter most often being little canvas or wooden houses on runners, in which the people live, eat, sleep en route.

In human interest there is not anything in Canada that excels this people of the last west. The country itself is interesting, its future is inviting, its settlement is a whole book of modern history. Homes, schools, churches, weddings are transforming the wilderness.—The Globe.

Day for Killing Gophers.

Days are set apart in various places for a great variety of objects, and certainly one of the most unusual days is one set apart for killing gophers. Kelso, Alberta, recently held its second annual gopher day. Owing, probably to there still being several inches of snow on the ground, the gophers killed this time were fewer in number than those slaughtered a year ago. However, enough were destroyed to give this season's crop a better chance for growth. The supper and entertainment following upon the day of killing were well enjoyed, and it is said that there will be no difficulty in celebrating gopher day every year—if the gophers can stand it.

The man who won the prize for the greatest destruction killed one hundred and fourteen gophers, and the winners of second and third prizes accounted for two hundred and one hundred and fifty-five, respectively. The winners seem to be in the same class as several royal hunters in Europe who are noted for getting great bags in their vast hunting grounds.

Debate on Population.

"Resolved that city life is preferable to country life" isn't a sufficiently exciting subject of debate for Medicine Hat and Lethbridge, so, a few nights ago, debating teams representing those places got together at Medicine Hat, in a Southern Alberta Debating League event, and fought a worthy war on the subject. "Resolved that Medicine Hat will have a larger population than Lethbridge in 1916." Medicine Hat won, but Lethbridge hopes that the next five years will prove that the decision reached in the debate was mighty poor prophecy.

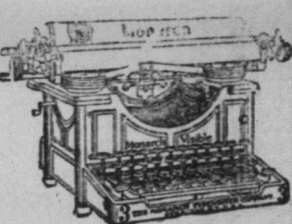
