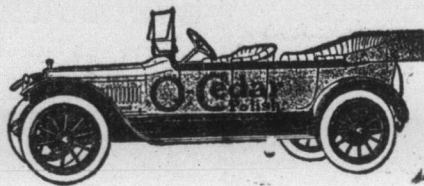

True Bills at Guelph

At the adjourned sittings of the Spring Assizes held in Guelph yesterday, before Chief Justice Sir William Mulock, the Grand Jury presented true bills for the murder of Alex. Malott, who is alleged to have been associated with them in the robbery of Mike Handyside. Southern Route West of London.

What is regarded as semi-official information was received in London from Toronto yesterday to the effect that the Provincial authorities have definitely decided in favor of the southern route between London and the Detroit frontier for the Provincial highway. The report adds, as proof of the statement, that work is to be undertaken in the near future on the permanent improvement of a section of road immediately west of St. Thomas. The same sources furnish the statement that work will be done this summer on three other sections west of Hamilton: the first between that city and Brantford; another between Woodstock and Ingersoll, and a third in Essex county near Windsor.

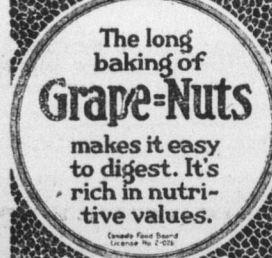
