Hon. Samuel Chipman.

This week we record the death of a man who for the last three quarters of a century has occupied an important place in the history of King's county, and especially of King's county.

Mr. Chipman was born in Cornwallis at the place now known as the Stratat Farm, on October 18th, 1790. In 1830 he was elected to the House of Assembly for Kings, succeeding his father, William Allen Chipman, and he took an active part in the struggle for responsible government.

Mr. Chipman was married twice. His first wife was Elizabeth, daughter of the late Col. Henry Gesner, Sr. She died in 1825, leaving four children, all of which are still living.

Carrots, parsnips, beets, onions, mangels, were a good crop; but turnips are small, owing to the wet weather in September. The yield of all these roots in this district with careful cultivation is enormous and profitable. Cabbages and cauliflower also grow well and are a most reliable and profitable crop here.

Small fruits were a good crop. The season was most favorable. In our district more attention is given to raspberries, currants, and gooseberries than to strawberries.

Plums and pears were a fine crop, but apples were below the average. In quality, however, they were superior to last year. They were a good size, well colored and more free from the scab (Tasialadium dentricum) than last year.
