Has been Treasurer of the Township and County Agricultural Soc. for several years, and is Deputy Reeve of the Tp. of Thurlow. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1883, and re-elected at last g. e. INGRAM, ANDREW B. (*West Elgin.*)

Grandfather was a native of Tyrone, Irel., and, after nineteen years' service in the British Army under the Duke of Wellington, came to Can., and died in the Co. of Halton, Ont., 1854. B. 23 April, 1851, at Strabane, Co. of Wentworth, and ed. at Morriston, Ont. M., 1 June, 1882, at St. Thomas, Miss Elizabeth McIntyre. Is a railway employee, and is Presdt. of the St. Thomas Trades and Labor Council. Occupied position of trust under the Clarke Administration in Manitoba in 1874. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g. e. A Conservative.—*St. Thomas.*

KERNS, WILLIAM. (*Halton.*)

Grandparents, who came from Germany, were among the first settlers in the Co. of Halton. B. in the Tp. of Nelson, 6 Sept., 1840. Ed. in the Common Sch. of the County and in St. Catharines. M., 25 March, 1868, Miss Ellen Morrison. Is a merchant, Senior Major of 29th Batt. V. M., Vice-Presdt. of the Canada Loan and Banking Co., and a dir. of the Federal Life Assur. Co., Hamilton. Was a mem. of the Public Sch. Board for ten years, Reeve of Burlington for four years, and Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Co. Council of Halton for three years. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1883, and re-elected at last g. e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Burlington, Ont.*
