Christian Island, Ont. May 25, 1921.

Meeting of the descendants of the Pottawatamies of Wisconsin, U.S.A. residing in the Province of Ontario in the Dominion of Canada, assembled in Council on the Christian Island Indian Reserve on the Twenty fifth day of May, 1921.

Chief Jas. L. King, in the Chair.

Henry Jackson, acting Secretary and Interpreter, Christian Island, Cape Croker, Chemong and Rama Bands being represented. The object of the said meeting to consider the application of Messrs. Kappler and Merrillat, Attorneys at law, Washington, D.C., U.S.A., after a careful consideration on the subject a resolution was unanimously adopted. RESOLVED,-

Moved by J.W. Keeshig, Cape Croker, Seconded by Chief Jas. L. King, Christian Island,- that we the descendants of the Pottawatamies of Wisconsin, U.S.A. assembled in Council the 25th. day of May, 1921, on the Christian Island Indian Reserve in the Province of Ontario, Can., do hereby set aside the application of Messrs. Kappler and Merrillat, Attorneys at law, at Washington D.C., U.S.A., that they be employed to represent the Canadian claimants of the said Pottawatamie claims of Wisconsin, U.S.A. It was also resolved that the said claimants are quite satisfied to have their interest looked after by their present Solicitor, A.G. Chisholm, London, Ont. under the general supervision of the Justice and Indian Departments and the said application of Kappler and Merrillat, be not further entertained. Carried unanimously.
