be paid arrears for himself and also for his wife, provided she has not already been paid under some other number in regard to which you should secure information. If she belonged to a family in the Band you should give her former Band number and in any case information should be furnished in the "Remarks" column as to the Band from whence she came. This information is necessary to prevent duplicate payments.

At the ensuing payments you should see that the clerk enters in the pay-list books full information in all cases requiring explanation. If you are in any doubt as to the Department's requirements on the above points, or with respect to any other matter bearing on the payments, you should request information and it will be furnished to you without delay.
