Sir, -

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 17th instant, in regard to your desire to obtain land on the Wood Mountain Indian reserve, and in reply to say that this reserve has not been surrendered by the Indians, and is not, therefore, in the market, as lands on an Indian reserve can only be disposed of after surrender thereof by the Indians under and in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Act.

In regard to your obtaining land in the West, it might be well for you to communicate with Mr. W. J. Black, Chairman, Soldier Settlement Board Ottawa.
