- Q. What condition was Gnr. Foster when you saw him?
- A. He wasn't too bad.
- Q. Did you see him again later on?
- A. Yes, in his bed.
- Q. What were the circumstances?
- A. He was asleep.
- Q. . What time was this?
- A. I don't know the exact time.
- Q. What was the approximate time?
- A. About 2310 or 2315 hrs.
- Q. Why weren't you relieved at 1120?
- A. I waited for him to relieve me.
- Q. Did you make any effort?
- A. I reported to Sgt. Walker.
- Q. If you saw Gnr. Foster 15 minutes before your time why didn't you do something then?
- A. He was under the weather.
- Q. What do you mean by "under the weather".
- A. He wasn't capable of doing his duty.
