Accordingly the House resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Cuthbert took the Chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair,

And Mr. Cuthbert reported, that the Committee had gone through the Bill and had made some Amendments thereto, which he was directed to report to the House whenever it should be pleased to receive the same: and he read the Report in his place, and afterwards delivered the fame, in at the Table, where it was again read by the Clerk.

And the faid Amendments being again read and the question severally put thereupon, they were feverally agreed unto by the House.

Ordered, that the Bill, as amended, be engrossed.

Mr. Planté moved, seconded by Mr. Berthelot, that this House do now resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, to consider of the most proper means of obtaining information concerning the Rights and Pretentions which this Province may have upon the College of Quebec, and the Estates thereunto annexed.

Whereupon the Honourable Mr. Young, one of His Majesty's Executive Council, rose in his place and said, that he was authorised by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor to inform the House that His Excellency, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Executive Council. had given Orders to take possession of the Estates of the Order of the Jesuits, in the name of and as the property of His Majesty.

Mr. Lees moved, seconded by Mr. Duniere, that the further consideration of the motion be postponed till Friday next.

The House divided upon the question,

Yeas 14 Nays 11

And there being a majority of three in the affirmative,

ORDERED, that the further confideration of Mr. Plante's motion be postponed till Friday next.

And then, on motion of Mr. Lees, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

The House adjourned till Friday next.
