Wire communications between Chihuahua City and Jaurez broken, presumably by bandits, Saturday, not been restored. Carranza officials here express the conviction that Villa's efforts to take the city, had been defeated, although the latest news received directly from the battlefield, indicated that the bandits during the fighting Saturday carried the conflict into the city proper,
