VILLA'S EFFORTS ARE DEFEATED

Mexican Bandit Has Finally Failed to Take Chihuahua.

Field Headquarters Punitive Expedition in Mexico, by Radio to Columbus, N. M., Nov. 27.—Concentration at Juarez of all Carranza soldiers in northwestern Chihuahua, has been ordered, according to authentic advices received here. Carranza garrisons in Madera, Pearson, El Valle, Namiquipa, Casas Grandes and Ascension are affected by this order.

Juarez, Mexico, Nov. 27.—The final result of the fighting between the Carranza forces and the bandits here, indicated that Villa's bandit army was unknown at the American border early today. Wire communications between Chihuahua City and Juarez broken, presumably by bandits, Saturday, had not been restored. Carranza officials here express the conviction that Villa's efforts to take the city, had been defeated, although the latest news received directly from the battlefield, indicated that the bandits during the fighting Saturday carried the conflict into the city proper, where they were finally ejected after heavy losses by both sides.

An account of the fighting early Saturday from an Associated Press representative at Chihuahua City was delayed by courier, at Saturday that short range fighting occurred Saturday in Zarco avenue and that the bandits were driven out of the plaza where they were raked with machine gun and artillery fire. The account also said that directing the bandits was riddled by the automobile in the village. Troops and the bandit leader was forced to flee on horse back.

Later advices, received by Carranza officials here from a station north of Chihuahua City, said that Jose Ynez Salazar, Villa's second in command was seriously wounded Saturday. This report was stated that the fighting continued late Saturday. American army officers at El Paso, received a report last night that the Carranza forces were driven out of the city. Carranza officials said they had received on such advices.
