AUSTRIAN FRONT IS CHANGED

Cabinet Officials, Including Michaelis and Von Kuehlmann Visit Army-Miners Demand Peace

The text reads: "There has been activity of both artillery in the region of Pantheon and Epine de Chevregny. A surprise attack by French troops to the east of Noisy Farm resulted in their bringing back prisoners.

Copenhagen, Aug. 9.—An official despatch from Berlin says that Dr. von Kuehlmann began his duties as foreign minister yesterday.

"In the region of Eparges, to the north of Vaux-les-Palameix, one of our detachments penetrated the German trenches and, after a spirited engagement in the course of which it inflicted heavy losses on the enemy and broke up his organizations, it returned without losses to our lines.

London, Aug. 8.—The British official communication issued tonight follows: "A heavy rain is again falling. Our allies gained further ground during the day northwest of Bixschote.

Amsterdam, Aug. 9.—Collins of waterproof cardboard are now being made in Germany, according to The Tageliche Rundschau of Berlin.

Zurich, Aug. 9.—In the explosion of two storehouses near Cracow, Galicia, on Aug. 1, 48 artillerymen were killed and many injured.

"Yesterday, in spite of continuous mist, our airplanes bombed the enemy's railway tracks, sidings, and trains forty miles behind the German lines, causing much damage, derailing one train and blowing up another.

THIRD OF U.S. DRAFT TO BE CALLED SOON

Will Be Summoned To Colors on Sept. 1, and Sent Into Training

Washington, Aug. 9.—Governors of states-to-day received notice from Provost Marshal Crowder that the first one-third of the quota of 687,000 men drafted for service in the national army will be called to the colors Sept. 1, and sent to training cantonments before Sept. 5.

RESULTS OF SUB WARFARE STILL LIGHT
