#### CANADA COMPANY QUESTION.

The London Free Press, in speaking of the Canada Land Company question, which has again been resarrected by A. B. McCoig, to all appearances, for unfair political pureses, says:

The position of the Canada Land Sempany has been the matter of leng standing complaint in this westerm province.

"Over half a sentury age the company was given a grant of land amounting to 250,696 acres at a nomind price on sandition of bringing in settlers. But it has presended as if the gift were a graft. If the condi-tions were fulfilled it is worth while to find out to what extent, and what the company has done in return for me preperty.

The question raised in the bill in broduced by Mr. McCoig, the member for West Kent, touches the titles of nersons who have purchased these lands not only for farming purposes but in regard to the minerals and petroleum found upon them. It is especially pointed as to the latter.

"Hon, Mr. Fey took a very able and in every way the proper course in asking that the bill withdrawn, for the purpose of obtaining more precise information as to the lawful status of the Canada Company, and for this purpose the Government promised to pay the expenses of a legal expert on a visit to England. This was done, Mr. Mc-Coig being well satisfied with the attitude of the attorney-general.

"Referring to our English files, we find that the company's annual meeting was held in London, December 27 last, presided over by Col. Her-bert L. Mitchell, R. A. The chairman, in his speech, set forth, among other details, that the lands sold in 1906, 5,432 acres, brought prices in excess of the book valuation, excepting 370 acres leased in Colborne, and 202 acres in Goderich. Two small parcels of land brought prices considerably in excess of the valuation "One of the parcels-that at Medoute -was sold to a railway company, and the other - in Bosanquet forms part of the land reclaimed by the drainage of Lake Burwell, where the general average valuation is at a low figure." In regard to minerals, the number of prospecting licenses Tover 3,140 acres of land) issued for mineral oil and gas was 45 against 34 last year.
