DROWNED****A Fatal Collision Occurred
In The St. Clair River
This Morning****STEAMER ERIN WAS SUNK**(Special to The Planet.)
The Canadian steamer Erin, with a cargo of 800 tons of coal, bound up from St. Catharines to Algoma Mills, was run down in the St. Clair river near the St. Clair yards of the great Lakes Engineering Co., about four o'clock Thursday morning, by a steamer, said to be the John B. Cowie, of the United States Transportation Co.'s fleet, and five members of the crew of the Erin were drowned.

The Cowie went right on, according to stories told by the survivors, not even checking down to give assistance. The Erin was struck amidships and was cut almost in two by the big steamer and sunk almost immediately in deep water.

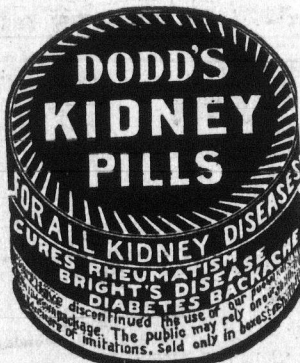

A BALLOON****More Theories Advanced
Regarding That Strange
Light****SAY IT MUST BE A COMET**Messrs. J. C. Wanless and Dan. Anquetil are still at variance with regard to the strange light that has been noticed in the western sky for some time past. They are not the only ones who have noticed it and wondered, but they both have theories about the phenomena, and they don't mind explaining them.
"I saw in The Planet last night," said Mr. Anquetil, "where someone said that it was a balloon with lights on it, sent up by a Bay City firm for advertising purposes. It can't be a balloon with lights on it. It would have to be a pretty strong light that could be seen one hundred and fifty odd miles away. It looked more like a comet or some astral body. I may be mistaken, but you can't make me believe that it is a balloon."
Mr. Anquetil's theory is partly substantiated by a traveller, who stated this morning that the strange light was plainly seen one night last week, in a city almost two hundred miles east of here, and that it looked just as bright there as it does here. People all over are puzzled over the thing, and wonder how it is that some scientist or astronomer has not come to the front with an explanation before now.
J. C. Wanless is inclined to accept the balloon theory, which, by the way, was first suggested by himself. "Sure it's a balloon," said Mr. Wanless. "Do you think that if it were a star or comet we would not have heard something about it before this? The astronomers would have had some announcement to make about it long ago. Still it does seem so plainly seen at such a great distance away. The light does not stay stationary. I watched it one night, and while I watched, it must have moved quite a distance. The lights used on the balloon must be strong electric ones."
The light has not been visible for some nights lately. On nights when it makes its appearance, it can be seen just some distance above the horizon in the western sky, just about the spot where the sun sets. It is much larger in appearance and of a yellower hue than any of the surrounding stars. It rises some nights at a very early hour, being visible on one occasion during twilight.
Comet, star, balloon or whatever it may be, it has been the cause of much wonderment among the watchers.**PROBABILITIES.**
