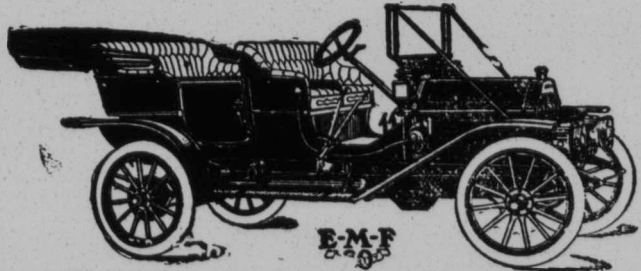

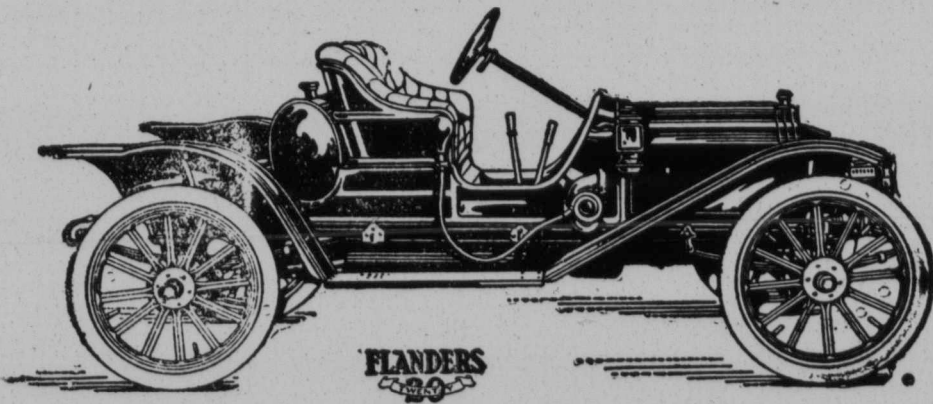

Mr. Murdoch Firth was the guest of Mr. Wm. Mann on Friday.

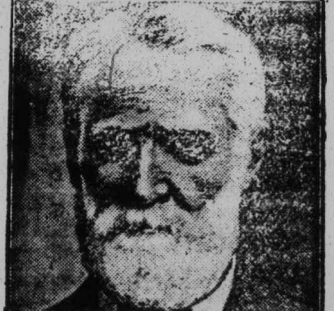
Mr. Donald Murray passed through here en route for Upper Linton last week.
