GREAT METEOR

Cities About Lake Michigan Women Dress Like Underworld, Thought it Earthquake Shock.

Detroit, Mich., Nov. 27.—That a meteor of tremendous size plunged into Lake Michigan last night causing of flames hundreds of feet into the air and visible for a radius of more than fifty miles, was the theory generally accepted early today in explanation of an earth shock which at first was believed to have been caused by a terrific explosion at some industrial

From reports from various Michigan, Indiana and Illinois cities where the blinding flare was visible, it ap-peared the centre of disturbance was near the lower end of Lake Michigan. Coast guards at Grand Haven were firm in their assertion that they had witnessed the descent of the heavenly

Residents of Battle Creek, Kalam-croo, South Bend, Grand Haven and other western Michigan cities fled from their homes in panic, fearing a arthquake. Houses were shaken and ountry was illuminated as by a brighun's rays, so all-enveloping that it as impossible to tell from which direction the flare came. 
