



## The Budget Speech.

The Finance Minister, Hon. M. P. Cashin, delivered his Budget Speech late yesterday afternoon before an outside audience, the smallest we have seen on Budget Day. He regretted the statements were not so encouraging as those he had presented in previous years. He attributed this to the Great War, the world wide de-pression which had preceded the War, the taking off of duties in 1913, and the failure of the new duties of 1914 to return the revenue he had expected. The shortage on June 30th last was nearly \$302,000, which was being covered by taking that amount from the cash Reserves. He tabled additional duties which came into force at 9.30 this morning, and these duties will be used to eke put the revenue for this year, as well as the duties imposed last September, yet in spite of his expectation of obtaining




