For my purpose it is a matter of in-difference whether Cape Bonavista or St. John's was the first place discov-ered. All the writers agree that New-foundland was discovered by Cabot on the 24th of June. There is unbroken traditions to that effect. The 24th of June is good enough for us. We ought to observe some day. Shall we go back on tradition and the historians of Newfoundland, even though so eminent a personage as His Excellency would damp our enthu-stasm by casting doubt on the long ac-cepted fact that Newfoundland, the be-ginning of the British Empire overseas was discovered by Cabot on the 24th of June, fourteen hundred and ninety-seven.
