The House concurred in the amend-ments made in Committee to the Bill for securing the Independence of the Legis lative Assembly after the following amendment on motion of the Attorney General was passed. The seventh sec-tion provided that, if a member of the Administration resigned his office, and within one month after his resignation, accepted any other office in the Adminis-tration, he should not therefore vacate his seat in the Legislative Assembly. The following words were added: " unless in the meantime the Administration of which such person was a member shall have resigned, and a new Administration shall have occupied the said offices." A change was also made so that the new bill would take effect from and after the dissolution of the present Legislative As-sembly.
