It is one of the most astounding and astonishing results of pure democracy -one of the results that even the most clear sighted political philosophers did not entirely anticipate. Eighty millions of people with manhood suffrage, equal tranchises for all, perfect equality, an imount of independence never reached by any community in the world before -millions, moreover, with a higher evel of education, with greater individual self-reliance, with more hopefulness and keenness than any population that ever was created-eighty millions of that kind of people finally dependent for the choice of their almost absolute ruler on the will of one man! It is a responsibility and a power before which even that of the Czar seems trivial.

There is this enormous difference, however, between the position of the "boss" and that of the Czar-that the 'boss" has to win his position by his own enormous strength of character, and that, difficult as it is to get his position, it must even be more difficult to retain it.
