WASHINGTON, D.C., July 2 .- Presi ent Wilson has denied the application for voluntary retirement of twenty nmanders and lieutenant-commanders of the navy who sought to leave the active list under the law, which permits such retirements on June 30, when pro-motions from the grade of junior lieunant have been less than forty during he preceding year.
