STEAMER WAS SLOW IN LOWERING BOAT Investigation Into Drowning of Hamilton Girl Is

Resumed Today.

Toronto, Aug. 22.—"I could have dived in and got her out, sir, but was prevented from doing so," said John Welsford to Captain Demers, who is investigating the circumstances surrounding the drowning of Miss Rita Glass on July 27, when her companion, Murray Tait, was rescued from an upturned canoe by a lifeboat from the Dalhousie City.

The body of Miss Glass has not been recovered.

Critcism of the delay in lowering the lifeboat featured today's evidence.

Keeping in the same direction, the Dalhousie City came within 150 to 200 yards from the canoe. The engines were then stopped. The canoe was then on the left side of the big boat, and a signal was given telling the canoeists to come around on the right side. The ship was fairly still as it stood on the water during the approach of the canoe.

An officer shouted orders to the canoe saying a lifeboat was being lowered and to keep away from the ship.
