The market today was not particularly large, following the holiday. Most of the business was transacted by the

Oats jumped 5c per cwt. The supply was not as plentiful as expectations during the week. Three loads of hay were brought \$18 per ton. Both dropped 1c. Beets and carrots at the per dozen bunches wholesale and carrots at 50c per dozen bunches. Peas sold at the rate of 50c per quart, and lentils at 40c per bushel. Peas were firmer in price. Good quality fruit sold at 22c to 25c per bushel. Apples, pears, plums and cherries wholesale, and 50c retail. There was a shortage of berries about this week. Strawberries sold at 50c to 60c a basket. Cherries sold at 60c to 65c a basket wholesale and 60c retail. There were no more cherries on the market today. Raspberries are expected to be more plentiful on Saturday.
