Two other great Australian nuggets were the Viscount and Countess of Canterbury, weighing 1,121 and 884 ounces respectively and valued at \$22,000 and \$16,000. At Dunolly two nuggets of 438 and 478 ounces were found, worth \$10,000 and \$9,000, so that it will be seen Australia still leads the world in the matter of big nuggets.

The record of America is said to belong to California, a nugget recovered there in 1849 or 1850 being worth something more than \$14,000.


