Cabinet Responsibility. The statement of Sir Oliver Mowat that he will not continue for a while as a member of his Government, but not responsible for all its acts hereafter, is somewhat of a wrench to the constitution.

Surely the first idea of government, as we know it, is that each member is responsible for it as a whole and that he cannot avoid accounting for every act of his government. If it cannot agree they must withdraw. But Messrs. Curran and Costigan set up a new practice last session at Ottawa, during Sir John Thompson's absence, when they voted against Charles Wallace, their colleague in the administration. Now Mr. Fraser is to be a part of the Local Government without responsibility.

Unless we are careful we must end in establishing a new practice and depart from the British idea. Let us quote a sentence from Prof. Bryce's chapter "On the Cabinet," taken from his "American Commonwealth":

Part I, chap. 9: The Ministers (in England) and the self-governing colonies are responsible to the legislature, and must resign office as soon as they lose its confidence. The Ministers are jointly, as well as severally, responsible to the public, in the sense that any act of theirs which falls on the whole Cabinet, unless one of them is shown to be acting on his own behalf and for his own interest, is the act of the Cabinet, and they are all responsible for it.

ATTACKING THE FARMER-GENERAL.

Owing to the outbreak of Tuberculosis at the Agricultural Fair—A Committee of Enquiry Asked.

In the Ontario Legislature yesterday Mr. McColl moved for a return showing the advertisements for the sale of the cattle offered at auction at the Agricultural College in December last, a list of the names of the purchasers and the prices paid for the animals and other facts.

Every homestead, when duly registered under this Act, shall be exempt from seizure for debt after July 1, 1894, or after the date of registration if later than July 1, 1894.

No homestead shall be exempt from sale for non-payment of taxes or for a debt incurred for the purchase thereof, nor exempt from the operation of the Mechanic's Lien Act.

In order to obtain the benefit of exemption under this act, a description of the property, containing a statement that it is designed to be held as a homestead, must be registered in the Registry Office.

The exemptions allowed by this act shall continue after the death of the person in whose favor it was exempted, or of one of the surviving husband or wife, so long as continued to be occupied as a homestead, or until the youngest child becomes 21.

The right of exemption shall not be affected by a suspension of the occupation of the homestead as a residence not exceeding one year.

The benefit of the exemptions shall only extend to a homestead within the limits of a city or town of over 5000 to a value of \$2000; in an incorporated village or town of less than 5000, to a value of \$1000, in the case of a homestead outside the limits of an incorporated village, town or city to a value of \$1000.

When a homestead is conveyed by the owner, such conveyance shall not subject the premises to any lien or encumbrance which it would not have been subject to in the hands of such owner; and the proceeds to the extent to which the homestead is exempt, shall be exempt for one year after the receipt thereof by the person entitled to the exemption, and if retained in a homestead shall be exempt from the same exemption as the original homestead.

When a building exempt as a homestead is conveyed to a third party, the exemption and a loss occurs, the insurance money shall be exempt to the same extent as the building would have been, if a mortgage executed after this act comes into force upon homestead property exempt is ineffective until the exemption has been cancelled, except that a mortgage valid to the extent of the purchase money of the property secured thereby.

In no case shall homestead property so encumbered be sold except to supply the deficiency remaining after exhausting any other property held for the payment of the same debt or encumbrance. If any balance shall remain after the payment of the debt and costs it shall be entirely on the exempted interest of the judgment debtor and be exempt to the same extent as provided in the case of a judgment debtor's interest in the proceeds of a forced sale.

A System which it is claimed will render Unusually Poles and Overhead Wires to Lowest Necessary.

Some time ago Thomas Harris, an electrician, announced to a few friends that he believed he had solved the problem of an underground electrical current for the propulsion of street cars.

The proprietors of the newspapers Advertiser, Gazette and Examiner of Barrie were the first to purchase the right to the use of a number of ratemeters in Hespeler respecting legislation to compel stationary engines in charge of boilers and engines of the Ontario Railway and Navigation Board to be examined by the Ontario Board of Examiners of the Ontario Association of Stationary Engineers after Jan. 1 next.

William McKay and others of Lindsay opposed the bill being given the Lindsay Council a purchase of \$20,000 for the waterworks, the firm of contractors being financially unwell, and issue bonds therefor without consulting the ratemeters.
