and then to invite members of the faculty to give addresses, and the recent utterances of Professors Watson and McNaughton have formed a valuable contribution to the work of the session. A brief reference to Doctor Watson's address on the subject of Heredity appears elsewhere in these columns.

It is perhaps beyond the province of the JOURNAL to make suggestions to the officials of the Y.M.C.A., but we cannot help remarking that the meetings of the Association would be much enhanced if a tetter hymn book were adopted than the one which is now used in the singing. We think no one will claim that the book of Gospel Hymns can for a moment compare with collections such as the Presbyterian Book of Praise or the Hymns Ancient and Modern of the Church of England. The probable argument for the use of the Gospel Hymns is that the collection is undenomination-But, apart from the title page, al. almost any good collection of hymns can claim the same characteristic ; and we think it would be a good step to inaugurate in the Friday meetings the use say of such a fine old collection as the Hymns Ancient and Modern.
