

21-Gun Salute and inspection of the Guard of Honour by Her Majesty. (Coverage will be normal with assigned positions indicated at previous Charlottetown briefings. A press room will be set up in the hangar with typewriters, telephones and telegraphic equipment available, and dark room facilities, if necessary. Food and other refreshments will be available. Flight Lieutenants E. D. Champagne and E. Paterson, as Public Relations Officers of the Station, will be assisted by the Central Press Relations Staff in looking after press needs.)

5:50 p.m. The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh leave
Approx. by automobile for the Department of Transport Dock, Summerside, en route to H.M.Y. *Britannia* anchored offshore. (Should members of the press wish to accompany the party, certain buses will proceed by a shorter route than that of the cavalcade before the procession starts, and others will follow the royal party. The town of Summerside is en route, and the press buses will proceed directly from the quay to Charlottetown in convoy. Should the weather be too inclement for embarkation on the *Britannia*, twelve hours previous notice will be given, and the Royal Couple will proceed directly by car to Charlottetown, there to board the *Britannia*, which, under these circumstances, will be anchored offshore at Charlottetown.)
