2. Whether any investigation has been held by the Federal Government in respect to distribution of direct relief by the province of Quebec, in 1932, in Lake St. John county.

3. If any investigation was held in 1932, the report of the investigators, and what action has been taken in connection therewith by the Federal Gov-

ernment.

The following Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers:-

By Mr. Fafard:—Order of the House for a copy of all telegrams, letters, correspondence, exchanged between all persons, corporations, or others, and the Dominion Government, from January, 1931, to date, in connection with the lowering of pilotage rates on the St. Lawrence.

By Mr. Blair:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence, plans, reports and other communications passing between E. A. Peck, M.P., and the engineers of the Department of Railways and Canals and all officials thereof, during the year 1932, regarding the construction of the bridge over the Otanabee River, known as the Lock's Bridge, south of the City of Peterborough, at dam 22 on the Trent Canal.

By Mr. Denis, for Mr. Pouliot:—Order of the House for a copy of the letter dated April 2, 1931, which was attached to the letter of the Assistant Deputy Minister of the Post Office Department to Dr. L. Duguay, M.P., dated October 2, 1931, in connection with the location of the post office of Metabetchouan, which was not included in the return No. 112, tabled on April 22, 1932.

The House resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Bennett: That it be resolved,—That it is expedient that Parliament do approve of the Trade Agreement entered into at Ottawa the 20th day of August, 1932, between representatives of His Majesty's Government in Canada and of His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, and that this House do approve of the same, subject to the legislation required in order to give effect to the fiscal changes consequent thereto.

And the Debate continuing;
