ACCEPTANCE OF GOVERNMENT CHEQUES BY COMMERCIAL BANKS

Question No. 706-Mr. Nesbitt:

- 1. Are commercial banks required to accept cheques issued by the Government of Canada, provided that the payee is properly identified?
- 2. Has the government received complaints that commercial banks are refusing to accept government cheques and, if so, what action has the government taken in this regard?

Hon. E. J. Benson (Minister of Finance): 1. No provision of the Bank Act requires a bank to accept cheques issued by the Govern-

ment of Canada or any other cheques if the person presenting such cheques does not maintain an account with the bank.

2. There have been a few complaints from persons who did not maintain an account with the bank at which the cheque was presented. Letters have been sent to those who have complained, explaining the situation set forth in (1) above.
