win the Grey Cup and so on. We know that motions moved under Standing Order 43 must concern urgent and essential matters, but since government members take pleasure in always saying no without even identifying themselves, this prevents opposition members and even government members from moving motions under Standing Order 43 which could be debated in the case of an emergency on a given day or during a given period.

We therefore request that application of motions moved under Standing Order 43 be referred to the Committee on Procedure and Organization so that it may study the right to move such motions, and especially the right to refuse them, subject to identification of the one who refuses the request of the hon. member to hold a special debate. The one who refuses this request should identify himself. This is why we ask that the principle of motions moved under Standing Order 43 be referred to the Committee on Procedure and Organization for a serious study so that this motion may be used intelligently in the future.

Mr. Speaker: Order, please. The question raised by the hon. member for Bellechasse (Mr. Lambert) and supported by the hon. member for Témiscamingue is very important and it has been raised as a question of privilege, which requires examination on the part of the Chair. I shall give this motion careful consideration and reserve my judgment until later. I would first like to say that many suggestions aimed at improving our Standing Orders have been made in this regard. I therefore accept this excellent suggestion concerning the Standing Committee on Procedure and Organization, but I note that this does not really constitute a question of privilege. However, I shall study the matter.
